

Day 1-5

Kafunta River Lodge, South Luangwa National Park

Day Itinerary

On arrival at Lusaka Airport, proceed through Customs and Immigration (visa fees to be advised by your consultant) and collect your luggage, make your way into the arrivals hall where you are met by a local representative and assisted to check in for Pro Flight scheduled flight to Mfuwe.

At Mfuwe Airport you are met by a representative from Kafunta Safaris. Road transfer through to Kafunta River Lodge where you spend 4 night on a fully inclusive basis, noting activities are shared with other guests.



SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK

South Luangwa is often named as one of Africa's best national park combining fantastic wildlife experiences and top quality guiding. South Luangwa is all about exploring the bush on foot. The famous walking safaris originated here and it is possibly Africa's finest walking destination.

Exploring the bush on foot is an especially interesting tranquil way to discover the small hidden treasures of this wildlife haven.

The Luangwa River with its distinctive ox-bow lagoons is said to have one of the most intense concentration of hippos and crocodiles in Africa. At night you will silently fall asleep with their snorts and grunts.

South Luangwa National park is home to over 60 mammal species and 400 birds. It has three endemic species, the beautiful Thornicroft giraffe with a more striking coloration than giraffes in the rests of Southern Africa, Cookson's wildebeest that is slightly more reddish and the Crawshay's Zebra, a subspecies of the plains Zebra, lacking the shadow stripes between the black stripes.

Activities: Day & night game drives, walking safaris and birding

Kafunta River Lodge is set in the riverside forest on the banks of the Luangwa River overlooking the South Luangwa National Park. This classic safari lodge offers guests all the expected comforts, while being situated in pristine unspoilt wilderness.

The lodge consists of 8 en-suite chalets and two luxury suites which also feature an upstairs viewing veranda and a luxurious bathroom with double sinks, two showers and a free-standing bath. All chalets and suites have a private veranda and stunning views of the flood plain and Luangwa River beyond.

Central to the lodge is the spacious bar and dining area. Built around a semi-evergreen wild mango tree and thatched in the traditional style, it offers superb panoramic views over the Luangwa River and the South Luangwa National Park. Great game viewing and bird watching from the lodge is guaranteed.

Adjacent to the Bar is the pool and the only natural hot spring tub in the Luangwa valley. This unique hot tub is fed from a source on Kafunta's grounds, offering a constant temperature of 38 degrees. Here you can enjoy pure relaxation while at the same time being presented with magnificent views over the flood plains and the Luangwa River.

The Lodge has its own pontoon about 5 minutes from the camp; the adventurous crossing takes you into the more remote areas of the Park - an alternative to the main gate 10 km (game driving drive) north of the Lodge.

The Lodge specialises in early morning as well as afternoon and into the evening game drive and also conducts walking safaris.

Airstrip Transfer Time: 45 minutes from Mfuwe Airport



Day 5-8

Waterberry Zambezi Lodge, Victoria Falls (Zambia)

Day Itinerary

The transfer back to Mfuwe Airport is arranged in accordance with the flight time for Pro Flight Mfuwe - Livingstone, you are assisted to check in, noting the flight usually involves an aircraft change at Lusaka Airport. On arrival at Livingstone Airport, you are met by a representative from Waterberry Zambezi Lodge and transfer to the lodge. Here you spend three nights on a fully inclusive basis with 2 in-house activities per day including Zambia entry fees to the Falls. NB: Zimbabwe Falls entry fees are NOT included



At Victoria Falls, the earth splits open and swallows one of Africa's greatest rivers, the mighty Zambezi, creating the largest sheet of falling water on earth. As the water hits the narrow depths of the Batoka Gorge beneath, it blasts a cloud of mist skywards, lending the falls their local name 'mosi-oa-tunya' (the smoke that thunders). When the Zambezi is at its fullest, the mist hangs a permanent raincloud above the falls, showering visitors on even the sunniest of days and visible for miles around.

Above the falls on the upper Zambezi, boats cruise the tranquil water at sunset while the distant spray catches the fading light downstream. Below the falls, the Batoka Gorge's rocky walls funnel the lower Zambezi into a chain of world-class rapids, prime for white water rafting.

Aside from being a UNESCO world heritage site and a natural world wonder, Victoria Falls also forms a natural border between Zimbabwe and Zambia. The falls can be seen from both countries, and for the most part the same activities are offered on both sides, from helicopter scenic flights to village visits and souvenir shopping.

Whether your idea of getting away from it all is a relaxed high tea in colonial grandeur or a heart-stopping bungee jump off a bridge, Victoria Falls keeps both the faint of heart and the most insatiable of adrenalin junkies busy for days.

From Zambia, a side on view of the falls is on offer with views into the Batoka Gorge, as well as the possibility of perching yourself at the edge of the falls on the vertigo-inducing Livingstone Island.

From Zimbabwe, you'll get a full-frontal view of three quarters of the falls' 1.7km wide curtain of water from viewpoints and footpaths meandering through a rainforest kept hot and humid by the spray of the falls.

Waterberry Lodge is situated on the banks of the Zambezi River about 22 km from Livingstone, towards Kazungula.

The main double-storey lodge area overlooks the Zambezi River and the game park beyond. Upstairs the main lounge is open to the high thatch with plenty of seating and boasts a well-stocked bar with magnificent views. Meals are served in the dining area or alfresco on the sun terrace that overlooks the river.

A floating pontoon gently sways on the Zambezi River, making it the perfect location for sundowners, fishing or just relaxing and enjoying the view. A large and welcoming swimming pool is set in the centre of our landscaped gardens and has a small plunge pool with a shallow end, making it safe for children.

The woodlands safari tents are situated 200 meters from the main lodge. Each tent has a dressing area, couch, en suite bathroom and outdoor seating area. There is a kitchen and lounge area for guest's exclusive use. Breakfast and all other meals may be enjoyed at the woodlands main area or at main lodge.

In-house activities include a tour of falls, sunset cruise, daytime cruise, fishing, island picnics, guided birding, guided village walk and guided tour of the town and local markets – depending on the rate basis these are included or excluded. All other activities offered in Livingstone can be organised at an additional cost and pre-booked or booked at the lodge on arrival.

Airport transfer time: 35 minutes



Day 8-10

Thlouwana Camp, Kasane Forest Reserve

Day Itinerary

Following breakfast and possible morning activity, time permitting, you will be met in the main area at a preappointed time for your road transfer across the Kazungula border into Botswana and Thlouwana Camp where you spend the following two nights on a fully inclusive basis (activities are shared with other guests). Please have your passports at hand and note that there may be delays at this border.



Kasane Forest Reserve is situated on the edge of Kasane and bordering Zimbabwe as well as the Nogatsaa area of Chobe. The Lesoma Valley lies within the Kasane Forest, which is characterized by dense trees as well

as open grasslands. Wildlife frequents the area, in particular elephants, buffaloes, and giraffes, and sightings at lodge waterholes in the valley can be quite good. For a full game drive experience along the Chobe Riverfront, the valley is a forty-minute drive through the forest reserve to access Chobe National Park via Sedudu gate. Boat cruises for lodges in Lesoma Valley depart from Kasane town.

Includes: meals, local drinks, activities, park fees and laundry

Excludes: premium drinks, additional activities

Activities: morning boat cruise and/ or afternoon game drives into the Chobe National Park. Night drives in Chobe Forest and/or a Lesoma Valley bicycle village tour are subject to availability.

Within easy access of the Chobe National Park, Tlouwana Camp is surrounded by impressive Acacia and Jackalberry trees, with all tents built on wooden decking. The Chobe boasts copious wildlife, most notably the richest concentration of elephants in Africa for which the region is famed.

The classically styled tents have fresh interiors and large sliding doors, with en-suite bathrooms as well as outdoor showers. Each tent's living area and outdoor deck provide ample relaxation spaces. Tlouwana is a family friendly camp and the family tents are designed to give parents some privacy with children close by.

The main camp area consists of the lounge, bar and dining facilities as well as a library, curio shop and an appealing swimming pool.

With the assortment of terrain and changing vegetation types, both morning boat cruises on the Chobe River and afternoon game drives into the Chobe National Park are bound to enthrall guests with the volume of wildlife in these differing habitats. Other activities offered includes night drives in the Chobe Forest Reserve and a Lesoma Valley cultural village tour by bicycle.

Lesoma Valley

This property is located in Lesoma Valley, which sits on the border with Zimbabwe and forms part of the Kasane Forest Reserve. Wildlife frequents the area, in particular elephants, buffaloes, and giraffes, and sightings at lodge waterholes in the valley can be quite good. For a full game drive experience along the Chobe Riverfront, the valley is a forty minute drive through the forest reserve to access Chobe National Park via Sedudu gate. Boat cruises for lodges in Lesoma Valley depart from Kasane town.

Airport Transfer Time: 25 minutes from Kasane Airport



Day 10-12

Nogatsaa Pans Chobe Lodge, Nogatsaa - Chobe National Park

Day Itinerary

Following breakfast and a possible morning activity (time permitting) you have a road transfer to Kasane Airport where you will be assisted with check in formalities for the onwards light aircraft transfer flight to the Nogatsaa Area. The following two nights you spend at Nogatsaa Camp on a fully inclusive basis (activities are shared with other guests). Please note that the flight is booked on a 'seat rate' basis and therefore flight times are not scheduled until the day prior to flying, lodge managers will arrange your activities and transfers accordingly. Please note that there is a strict luggage restriction on all light aircraft flights of 15kg per person in soft bags, plus 5kg hand luggage and there may be up to 3 stops en-route.



Situated in the Chobe National Park, Nogatsaa is a very distinctive, remote and wild area away from the hustle and bustle of the Chobe Riverfront. The territory remains untouched, with sweeping expanses of grasslands with mopane and deciduous woodlands.

The area has a cluster of natural clay-bottom pans which fill during the rainy season, they are magnets for game and provide water well into the dry season. Nogatsaa Lodge pumps a few of the waterholes making them a guaranteed source of water all year round. Four of the waterholes also have "hides" (raised wooden platforms) which lend themselves to some amazing game sightings: herds of elephant, buffalo and antelope stop by. Interesting species include eland, roan, sable antelopes and with luck the delicately limbed oribi.

Activities: game drives

The Nogatsaa Pans is situated in the Chobe National Park, approximately 80 km south of the Chobe River front area. This cluster of pans fill with water in the rainy season and during the dry season get supplemented with borehole water. Four of the waterholes also have game viewing hides which lends itself to some amazing wildlife sightings and Nogatsaa Pans Lodge, overlooks the Kwikamba Pan.

Accommodation consists of twelve tented rooms of which two are family rooms. Each room has en suite facilities and a private viewing deck. The family rooms consist of a lounge and two bedrooms joined by an en-suite bathroom.

Nogatsaa Pans Lodge is fully run on solar power which significantly reduce the site's environmental impact.

The main area overlooks the natural pan and accommodates the lounge, dining and bar as well as the curio shop and small library. Guests can relax by the pool during the day and gather around the boma area at night.

Activities offered include morning and afternoon game drives, birdwatching and stargazing. The lodge also offer private dinners and sundowner drives.

Airport transfer time: 10 minutes from Nogatsaa Airstrip



Day 12-14

Monachira Camp, Moremi Game Reserve

Day Itinerary

Following breakfast and a possible morning activity (time permitting), you have a light aircraft transfer flight to Monachira Camp where you spend the following two nights on a fully inclusive basis (activities are shared with other guests).



The Moremi Game Reserve is all about searching for big game; where the habitats are as diverse as the wildlife itself. Water-adapted antelopes and wary-eyed buffaloes spill out into floodplains, behind towering woodlands where leopards hide on the high branches. Dead trees cast silhouettes over elephant-filled savannas a stone's throw from papyrus-fringed channels stretching out to the delta beyond.

When you arrive in the Moremi Game Reserve, it's anyone's guess what you'll find lurking in the long grass. From wild dogs stalking waterbucks to long sunsets by a hippo-filled lagoon, the scenes will live on in memory long after the journey home.

Kick up sharp smelling clouds of dust on a morning drive, disturbing pockets of warm air in the reeds as you splash through water crossings in pursuit of a distant lion's call. Pause by the edge of large lagoons, squinting to catch mischief making hyenas as they emerge from the trees to drink.

When you get sick of game drives, discover the channels by boat while Squacco herons fly alongside you into the wind. Watch a lazy sunset with the blue-cheeked bee eaters before returning to dry land for more hardcore bush exploration.

As Moremi Game Reserve is bound by national park rules, activities here are limited to game drives during hours of daylight with no off-roading, and boat cruises on the permanent channels.

While most of the reserve is open to the public, two private lodges sit in the Mombo Concession to the north of Chief's Island, surrounded by the waters of the Okavango Delta. Boating isn't possible here, instead the area offers the ultimate in dry-land game viewing. Hailed as Botswana's predator capital, this exclusive corner is closed to outsiders and home to the big five, where the invitee list fills up years in advance.

Activities: Game drives, walking, birding, mokoro and boating (seasonal & water-level dependant)

Monachira Camp is a new camp situated along the Monachira Channel in the Okavango Delta, within the Moremi Game Reserve. The camp focuses on experiencing the water wonderland of the Okavango Delta, activities are water focused. This prime location offers guests breathtaking views of the floodplains and wetlands that stretch beyond the camp.

The camp features eight luxurious tents and two spacious family tents, each designed to provide a comfortable and elegant stay amidst the wilderness. All tents are raised on wooden decks to enhance views of the surroundings and are equipped en-suite bathrooms. The family tents are ideal for larger groups, as they include two bathrooms, ensuring privacy and convenience.

Monachira Camp's main area is designed to maximize relaxation and delight of the Delta's beauty. It includes both tented and outdoor dining spaces where guests can savor delectable meals while taking in the panoramic views. There is a refreshing swimming pool for cooling off during hot afternoons, and a well-stocked curio shop for those looking to purchase unique souvenirs. A separate sunset bar, positioned to overlook the river, offers a serene spot to unwind with a drink and witness the vibrant colors of the African sunset.

Day Itinerary

Following breakfast and a possible morning activity (flight time permitting) you will transfer by light aircraft to Maun Airport in time for own onwards travel arrangements. You will be met by a representative from Safari Specialists upon arrival into Maun to assist with check in for own onwards travel arrangements.

Travel Information

Please take note of our Booking Terms & Conditions. It will be understood that these have been read and accepted by you on receipt of confirmation of the booking.

- For your safety and peace of mind, on confirmation of your booking, we strongly recommend that Travel Insurance is arranged to cover cancellation, curtailment, emergency evacuation, medical and repatriation expenses, damage/theft/loss of personal luggage, money and goods.
- Road and air transfers and activities are quoted on a seat basis (shared) unless otherwise requested or specified. Passengers may have various stops en-route to a destination. The transfer or charter company reserves the right to specify departure and arrival times. Private charters and airport assistance from arrival to departure can be requested at an additional cost.
- Passengers exceeding 100kg are kindly asked to notify us at the time of booking as a surcharge may be applicable on internal flights due to smaller aircraft having strict weight limits in compliance with industry safety regulations.
- The costs are subject to change at any time due to fluctuations in fuel costs, taxes, levies, government regulations, rate of exchange and factors that are imposed upon us by our suppliers that are beyond our control.
- Please advise us of the ages of children (under 18) travelling, together with their date of birth, at the time of booking as not all lodges accept children and there may be restrictions or conditions which can affect pricing.
- We recommend that optional activities be booked in advance at time of confirmation to guarantee availability e.g Dinner cruises in Victoria Falls
- Please allow a minimum 2-3 hours connection time in Johannesburg for international flights. It is important that you check that your flight tickets have been issued in your full names as per your passport. Ensure that your luggage is checked through to your final destination to avoid the need to collect and recheck it during transit, such as at OR Tambo International Airport
- We require full payment for international and domestic scheduled flights at the time of confirmation e.g Airlink JNB/MUB, Proflight LIV/LUN within Zambia. We are not able to guarantee any flights before receipt of payment as seats are often held for a limited period before ticketing is required so this is a time sensitive issue. Air tickets are considered non refundable unless otherwise specified. Please confirm the details with your consultant at the time of booking.

Passports, Visas and Travel Documentation

Your passport must have at least 6 months validity before the expiry date and 6 empty pages (not including the endorsement pages). The onus is upon the guests to ensure that passports and visas are valid for the countries visited. Please note that certain visas can take up to 3 months to be processed so please consider this when booking.

If you are travelling with children through Southern Africa, please be aware that you will be required to have certified copies of their unabridged birth certificates, and passports on hand. If you are not their legal parents, or if only one of you is travelling – you will need to have consent in the form of an affidavit giving you permission to travel with the child.

Inter-camp transfers

Due to the remote locations of the areas in Southern Africa - your itinerary may include road, boat, helicopter and air transfers in small aircraft.

On shared air transfers, all the flight times between lodges are arranged a few days before the flights take place to avoid endless schedule changes. The lodge or camp where you are staying will be advised of your departure time the day before travel and will ensure that you are at the airstrip on time. Although every effort will be made to ensure that guests are transferred together in one vehicle / aircraft, this cannot be guaranteed, especially with larger groups. The aircraft used for inter-camp transfers vary in size from 3-, 5-, 7-

and 12-seater aircraft. We recommend that guests susceptible to motion sickness take appropriate precautions due to flying conditions.

Weight & Luggage Restrictions

There are strict luggage restrictions in place on any itinerary, which includes light aircraft transfers for safety reasons. Luggage, including camera equipment and hand luggage, is restricted to 20 kg per person travelling on seat rates. Only soft bags will be accepted - no hard suitcases or bags with rigid frames can be transported, as they physically cannot fit into the aircraft.

The maximum dimensions of the soft bags that can be accommodated are as follows: 25cm/10 inches wide x 30cm/11 inches high and 62cm/24 inches long. Please keep in mind that the baggage compartments on the light aircraft are only 25cm high, so the pilots must have the ability to manipulate the bag into the compartment. Note that laundry can be done on a daily basis at most camps and lodges and they also offer amenities (shower gel/shampoo).

Should you arrive with excess baggage without prior warning, your baggage could be delayed, as we may have to fly the baggage into camp at a later stage at considerable extra cost to you. However, should you notify us in advance that your baggage will exceed the limit; we may be able to assist you with alternative arrangements e.g. storage or purchase of additional luggage allowance.

For bookings including flights within Zambia & Mozambique, please note luggage weight exceptions under destination information.

Lost Luggage

Lost luggage on international flights is a common problem facing travellers today. We suggest that you pack a small bag with your essentials, including any life sustaining medication, which can be carried with you as hand luggage. If travelling as a couple or family we suggest that you split your clothing between bags so that if one bag gets lost, you will have basic items on hand to see you through the first couple of days while we try and recover your lost baggage.

Please note that whilst we try our utmost to locate and re-unite you with your bags, that there may be charges involved in getting your bags to remote areas, which would be for your cost. Please remember to report the lost luggage to the airline as soon as you make the discovery - the airline will issue you with a Baggage Claim Form, which you will need in order for us to trace the bag.

Health and Dietary

Please note that you are travelling to a Malaria-risk area. Please consult your doctor for medical advice prior to travel.

Although usually safe to drink, we do not recommend that you drink the tap water. Filtered water is available at the camps and lodges.

The camps are remote, with limited power supply and access to resources, so it is very important to notify us in advance of any special dietary requirements, medical conditions and medical equipment you may need with you. Please carry critical medication in your hand luggage.

Yellow Fever Certificates - are only required if you have travelled to a Yellow Fever area as designated by the World Health Organisation. Please check with your Travel Clinic or doctor well in advance of your departure date.

General Travel Information

- Safari Camps and lodges offer limited electricity usually generated by solar or generator in order to make provision for charging cameras and electronic devices.

- Please ensure that you do not pack any valuables, cameras, cash, laptops travel documents and medication in your checked in luggage – these should be kept on your person at all times.
- Please notify us immediately of any changes to flight arrival and departure details as this affects onward transfer arrangements.
- Please note that most camps & lodges in Botswana do not have double beds. Twin beds are pushed together to make up a double room.
- Although every effort is made to adhere to schedules the company reserves the right and in fact is obliged to occasionally change routes and camps on safaris as dictated by changing conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
- By confirmation of the booking, you acknowledge that you have been made aware and accept that the tour carries inherent risks, and that you voluntarily assume all risks which are associated with the tour. You will be required to sign indemnities at the various camps, lodges and service providers, and abide by their operators' code of conduct in order to ensure your safety.
- If you have any cause for complaint while travelling, you should immediately bring it to the attention of the camp manager and / or our Maun office that will attempt to resolve the situation immediately.
- Do not remove any animal artefacts, flora or fauna from any of the areas you visit, as there are strict international regulations on the export of such items.



Currency

The official currency in Zambia is the Zambian Kwacha. US\$ Dollar notes (2007 Series onwards), and Visa and MasterCard are accepted.

Visa

Effective 1st November 2022 the Zambian Department of Immigration has waived visa requirements for Australia, Canada, China, European Union (except Switzerland), Gulf States (Bahrain, Kuwait, Iraq, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates), Japan, South Korea, United Kingdom and United States of America.

Nationals of the above-listed countries will not require visas to enter Zambia (*however, the waiver of the visa does not grant permission for entry into Zambia as the final decision rests with the immigration officer at the port of entry*).

Fees for Visitors from all other countries not listed above who are eligible to receive their visa on entry are: US\$ 25.00 for single entry/ US\$ 40.00 for double entry/ U\$D 75 multiple entry / Transit visa U\$D 25 / Day Tripper U\$D 10.

Internal Flights and Transfers

On fly-in safaris, movement between the game areas is done on a scheduled basis by Proflight Zambia unless otherwise specified. Proflight uses 12, 18 and 29 seater aircraft for their flights. Transfers between camps in the same game area may be done by light aircraft, but mostly by road/game drive transfer or by boat on a shared seat basis.

Flight times around Zambia | Approximate Proflight flying times

Livingstone to Lusaka 1 hour

Lusaka to Royal or Jeki Airstrip for Lower Zambezi 35 min

Lusaka to Mfuwe Airport for South Luangwa 1 hour 10 minutes

Mfuwe Airport to Lilongwe Airport 1 hour

All flights Livingstone to Mfuwe/Lower Zambezi are all via Lusaka and vice versa!

Departure Taxes

Departure taxes are included in ticket prices.

Weight & Luggage Restrictions

The luggage allowance is 15kg per person. Excess baggage will be charged extra for. Any bag over 32kg will not be flown. Only one piece of hand luggage with a maximum weight of 5kg is allowed per person. Please note that a handbag is considered as a piece of hand luggage.

Internal Flights and Transfers

Due to the remote areas the camps and lodges are based in, transfers between camps may take place by boat, mokoro, game drive vehicle or light aircraft.

Flight times around Botswana | Approximate flying times

Flight duration times (as listed below), are to be used as an average guideline. They are based on actual flying time, and passengers may have various stops en-route to a destination affecting the total travel time. Your pilot will brief you of your flight route and duration during the safety briefing.

Maun - Delta: 15 to 30 minutes

Delta – Delta: 10 to 20 minutes

Delta - Linyanti: 30 to 40 minutes

Maun – Linyanti: 50 to 60 minutes

Linyanti - Kasane: 40 to 60 minutes

Maun/Delta - Kasane: 60 to 80 minutes

Maun - Makgadikgadi/Desert: 40 to 60 minutes
